This powerful book gets under your skin — *The Cold Light of Distant Stars* is a bittersweet memoir of growing up in the Soviet Union during 1980s. Galkina's writing is poetic, evocative and amusing, enriched by her fluency in both Russian and German. Her dry humour provokes funny episodes and laugh-out-loud situations. *The Cold Light of Distant Stars* is the Russian-German equivalent of Jonathan Safran Foer's *Everything is illuminated*, Elene Gorokhova's *A Mountain of Crumbs* or Frank McCourt's *Angela's Ashes*. Anna Galkina has an original, vibrant, and colourful voice and her debut novel deserves to be widely read.
